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How to Reach Srinagar

By Air

- Sheikh Ul-Alam International Airport (Srinagar Airport):
 - o Located about 15 km from the city center.
 - Well-connected with major cities in India such as Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, and Chandigarh.
 - o Several airlines operate daily flights to and from Srinagar.
 - o From the airport, you can hire a taxi or take a pre-booked transfer to reach your destination in Srinagar.

By Rail

- Nearest Railway Station Jammu Tawi:
 - o Located approximately 300 km from Srinagar.
 - o Jammu Tawi is well-connected to major cities in India, including Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, and Kolkata.
 - o From Jammu Tawi, you can hire a taxi, take a bus, or use shared cabs to reach Srinagar. The journey by road from Jammu to Srinagar takes about 8-10 hours.
- Upcoming Railway Station Udhampur:
 - o Located about 230 km from Srinagar.
 - Once fully operational, Udhampur railway station will offer a more convenient rail option for reaching Srinagar.
 - o Similar to Jammu Tawi, you can hire a taxi or take a bus from Udhampur to Srinagar.

By Bus

- Jammu & Kashmir State Road Transport Corporation (JKSRTC):
 - o Provides regular bus services from Jammu to Srinagar.
 - o Both luxury and standard buses are available.
 - The bus journey from Jammu to Srinagar takes around 8-10 hours, depending on the road and weather conditions.

• Private Buses:

- o Numerous private operators run buses from cities like Delhi, Chandigarh, and Jammu to Srinagar.
- o Options range from semi-sleeper to sleeper and luxury coaches.

• Local Transport within Srinagar:

o Once in Srinagar, you can use local transport such as auto-rickshaws, taxis, and buses to get around the city and visit nearby attractions.

Note: Except for Srinagar, most places in Kashmir require vehicles to stop at designated parking areas due to strict union rules. To explore these locations, you will need to hire a pony or use local union vehicles. This rule is set by the local transport union. Wherever vehicles are allowed, we will cover those areas. Otherwise, you will need to hire additional transport. We will assist you in hiring these additional vehicles, with charges fixed by the union, typically ranging from Rs 1000 to Rs 5000 per non-AC vehicle for up to 6-7 tourists.

Sightseeing Places of Kashmir.

Following are the sightseeing Places where tourist can visit, charges may be additional for out locations and for those places where only local union vehicles are allowed. There are some of the places in Srinagar, Sonamarg, Gulmarg, Pahalgam where only union vehicles are allowed. You can check the prices with us for that additional Location . Wular Lake, Aru valley, Betaab Valley, Cahndanwari, Zero Point, Druk Fall, Gurez Valley etc are some names.

Sightseeing Places base Point Srinagar

Srinagar

- Srinagar is often called the "Venice of the East".
- Lakes around the city include Dal Lake, noted for its houseboats, and Nigeen Lake.
- Wular Lake (72 kms towards Sopore) and Manasbal Lake (32 kms towards Ganderbal) lie to the north of Srinagar.
- Wular Lake is one of the largest freshwater lakes in Asia.

Dal Lake

- Dal is a lake in Srinagar (Dal in Kashmiri means Lake).
- The urban lake is integral to tourism and recreation in Kashmir, known as the "Jewel in the crown of Kashmir" or "Srinagar's Jewel".
- The shoreline of the lake, about 15.5 kilometres (9.6 mi), is lined with Mughal era gardens, parks, houseboats, and hotels.
- Scenic views of the lake can be witnessed from shoreline Mughal gardens like Shalimar Bagh and Nishat Bagh, built during the reign of Mughal Emperor Jahangir.
- Houseboats cruising along the lake in colorful shikaras offer picturesque views.
- During winter, the temperature sometimes reaches –11 °C (12 °F), freezing the lake.

- The lake covers an area of 18 square kilometres (6.9 sq mi) and is part of a natural wetland covering 21.1 square kilometres (8.1 sq mi), including its floating gardens.
- The floating gardens, known as "Raad" in Kashmiri, blossom with lotus flowers during July and August.

Shikara Ride

- The shikara is a type of wooden boat found on Dal Lake and other water bodies in Srinagar, Jammu and Kashmir.
- Shikaras vary in size and are used for multiple purposes, including transportation.
- A usual shikara seats six people, with the driver paddling at the rear.
- Like the Venetian gondolas, they are a cultural symbol of Kashmir.
- Some shikaras are still used for fishing, harvesting aquatic vegetation (usually for fodder), and transport, while most are covered with tarpaulins and used by tourists.
- Some are used as floating homes.
- The craft relies on deodar wood (which does not decompose in water) and ranges from 25 to 41 feet in length.
- The pointed front end is followed by a central section made of 8 planks of wood, and the boat eventually ends in a flat rear segment.
- Two planks of wood lend each side elevation a vertical height of 1.5 feet.
- It has a conspicuous spade-shaped base.

Hari Parbat Fort

- Hari Parbat, also called Koh-i-Maran, is a hill overlooking Srinagar, the largest city and capital of Jammu and Kashmir, India.
- The site includes a fort built by the Durrani Empire, a Hindu temple, mosques, and a gurdwara.
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- The first fortifications were constructed by Mughal emperor Akbar in 1590, who built an outer wall for the fort as part of his plans for a new capital at the site of modern-day Srinagar.
- The project was never completed.
- The present fort was built in 1808 under the reign of the Governor of Kashmir Province of the Durrani Empire, Atta Mohammed Khan.
- The fort can be reached via two routes: Rainawari through Kathi Darwaza Gate and Hawal through the Sangin Darwaza Gate.
- The fort was closed for almost two decades and reopened to the public in 2007.

Shankaracharya Temple

- The Shankaracharya Temple, also known as the Jyeshteshwara Temple, is located on top of the Shankaracharya Hill on the Zabarwan Range in Srinagar, Jammu and Kashmir, India.
- It is dedicated to Lord Shiva.
- The temple is at a height of 1,000 feet (300 m) above the valley floor and overlooks the city of Srinagar.
- The temple dates back to 220 BCE, although the present structure likely dates to the 9th century CE.
- It was visited by Adi Shankara and has since been associated with him, thus gaining the name Shankaracharya.
- It is also regarded as sacred by Buddhists.
- Some historians believe the temple was originally a Buddhist site that was later converted into a Hindu place of worship by Adi Shankaracharya.

Badamwari

- Badamwari Garden is known for the early bloom of flowers on almond trees, attracting nature lovers and tourists alike.
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- Situated at the foothills of Hari Parbat, the 300-kanal garden is dotted with trees, flowers, and cascades, providing a soothing experience.
- The garden is in full bloom during the spring season, with fragrant air and beautiful white flowers.
- Visitors can enjoy a stroll along the walkways, watching the beautiful flowers, especially in the evening.
- The garden is a popular spot for tourists who come to witness its splendid beauty.

Tulip Garden

- Indira Gandhi Memorial Tulip Garden, previously Model Floriculture Center, is a tulip garden in Srinagar.
- It is the largest tulip garden in Asia, spread over an area of about 30 hectares.
- Situated on the foothills of the Zabarwan Range with an overview of Dal Lake.
- Opened in 2007 to boost floriculture and tourism in Kashmir Valley.
- Built on sloping ground in a terraced fashion, consisting of seven terraces.
- Apart from tulips, it features many other species of flowers such as hyacinths, daffodils, and ranunculus.
- Hosts an annual Tulip Festival to showcase the range of flowers in the garden, promoting tourism.
- The festival is organized during the onset of the spring season in Kashmir Valley.
- Tulip plantation begins in September before the start of the winter season.
- It is the most spacious garden in Srinagar compared to other Mughal Gardens.
- Major attraction: large variety of tulips found in thousands, creating a heavenly sight during the full bloom season with all shades of the rainbow scattered on the fields.

Botanical Garden

- Set up in 1969, situated around the base of a hill overlooking Dal Lake.
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- Contains many types of plants and vegetation, with a collection of about 150,000 ornamental plants and a huge collection of oak varieties.
- Also houses a rare collection of Kashmiri tropical plants.
- Attracts visitors from various parts of the world.
- Divided into four main sections: the Plant Introduction Centre, the Research Section, the Recreational Garden, and the Botanical Garden.
- The Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Botanical Garden is open from 9:00 am to 7:00 pm.

Pari Mahal

- Pari Mahal, or The Angels' Abode, is a seven-terraced garden located at the top of the Zabarwan mountain range overlooking Srinagar and south-west of Dal Lake.
- Depicts Islamic architecture and patronage of art during the reign of Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.
- Built by Mughal Prince Dara Shikoh in the mid-1600s, it served as a library and an abode for him.
- Used as an observatory for teaching astrology and astronomy.
- A five-minute drive from Cheshmashahi Garden.

Chashma Shahi

- Chashma Shahi or Chashma i Shahi (translation: the royal spring), is one of the Mughal gardens built in 1632 AD around a spring by Ali Mardan Khan, a governor of Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.
- Built as a gift for his elder son Prince Dara Shikoh.
- Located in the Zabarwan Range, near Raj Bhawan (Governor's house), overlooking Dal Lake in Srinagar.
- Open for tourists from March to November, with full bloom during May and June.
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Nishat Bagh

- Nishat Bagh is a terraced Mughal garden built on the eastern side of Dal Lake.
- Located on the bank of Dal Lake, with the Zabarwan Mountains as its backdrop.
- Commands a magnificent view of the lake beneath the snow-capped Pir Panjal mountain range to the west of the valley.
- Designed and built in 1633 by Asif Khan, elder brother of Nur Jehan.

Shalimar Bagh

- Shalimar Bagh is a Mughal garden in Srinagar, linked through a channel to the northeast of Dal Lake.
- Emperor Jahangir built Shalimar Bagh in 1619 to please his queen, Nur Jahan.
- Originally called 'Farah Baksh' ('the delightful'), later extended by Emperor Shah Jahan's orders in 1630 and renamed 'Faiz Baksh' ('the bountiful').
- Became a pleasure place for the Pathan and Sikh governors who followed Zafar Khan.

Lal Chowk

- Named by left-wing activists inspired by the Russian Revolution, as they fought the princely state's Maharaja, Hari Singh.
- Traditionally a place for political meetings, with addresses from leaders like Jawaharlal Nehru and Sheikh Abdullah.
- The clock tower at Lal Chowk was built in 1980.
- In 1990, separatists dared anyone to raise the flag of India at Lal Chowk. The National Security Guards took up the challenge and raised the flag.
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Nigeen Lake

- Name Origin: The lake is surrounded by a large number of willow and poplar trees, leading to its name "Nigeen," which means "the jewel in the ring." It is a local variant of "nageena."
- **Location**: Adjacent to the Hari Parbat hillock, west of Dal Lake. The locality of Hazratbal, known for its famous shrine, lies to its northeast.
- **Tourist Attraction**: Known for its relatively pristine waters compared to Dal Lake. Houseboats and Shikaras are common sights.
- Activities: Ideal for swimming due to being deeper and less crowded than Dal Lake.
- Characteristics: Nigeen Lake is mildly eutrophic and sometimes considered part of Dal Lake, connected by a narrow strait. It is also linked to Khushal Sar and Gil Sar lakes via Nallah Amir Khan.

Harwan Garden

- Location: Situated in Harwan Village, 19 km from Srinagar.
- **Features**: A large and admired tourist spot with a canal bordered by Chinar trees and blossoming flower beds, originating from a lake behind the garden.
- Attractions: Known for its natural beauty and charm, with big green grass lawns and snowy backdrops.
- Activities: Perfect for picnics, excursions, and nature walks. The garden is also the gateway to Dachigam Wildlife Sanctuary.
- Accessibility: Reachable by taxis within half an hour from Srinagar.

Dachigam National Park

- Location: 22 km from Srinagar in Jammu and Kashmir, covering an area of 141 sq km.
- Name Origin: The name "Dachigam" means "ten villages," in memory of the ten villages relocated to create the park.
- Best Time to Visit: Open throughout the year, but the best time is between April and August.
- Wildlife: Contains the last viable population of the Hangul or Kashmir Stag. Home to over 150 species of birds, including Crimson Tragopan, Monal Pheasant, Blood Pheasant, Koklas Pheasant, Golden Eagle, and Lammergeier.
- Park Sectors: Upper and Lower Dachigam, with altitudes ranging from 1,700 to 4,300 meters.

Zeashta Devi Shrine, Zaethyar

- Origin relates to an important event during the churning of the great ocean, Kshirasagra.
- Goddess Lakshmi was bestowed to Lord Vishnu by the Devtas, which angered the Asuras.
- Asuras snatched Goddess Lakshmi from Lord Vishnu and kept her in captivity in a cave called "Guptagara" (now Gupkar).
- Lord Shiva created Goddess Zeashta and Vira Vaitala to annihilate the Asuras and free Goddess Lakshmi.
- After the task, Lord Shiva bestowed them with the power of protection and upliftment of mankind.
- Located near Gupkar in Srinagar.
- Devotees worship Goddess Zeashta for protection and grace.
- Tradition of offering 'cooked yellowish rice' (tehar) on Thursdays during the month of Zyesth.

 Annual Mahayagya is held on Zyesht Krishnapaksh Panchami, with free boarding and lodging for devotees for three days.

Durga Nag Temple

- Known for its holy spring, built above and around it.
- Visitors seek peace and perform traditional Vedic rituals at the sanctuary.
- Features a wish well where devotees believe their wishes are fulfilled by Durga Maa and Siddha Peeta.

Meruvarddhanaswami Temple (Pandrethan Temple)

- Located 5 km from Srinagar, near the north of the Jhelum River.
- Features a shrine dedicated to Lord Shiva, enclosed by a waterhole.
- Impeccable ancient architecture with perfect geometry and symmetry.
- Unique ceiling design carved from a single piece of rock, pyramidal in shape and segregated into two parts.

Maa Jwala Temple, Khrew Pulwama

- Located on the Zabarwan Mountain range, 20 km from Srinagar.
- Reachable by 350 long devri stone steps.
- Architecture signifies fine Kashmiri culture.
- Dedicated to Goddess Jwala (Fire), Ishta Devi for many Kashmiri Pandits.
- Annual fair held in June or July where devotees offer Yellow Rice and Shooshnor to Goddess Jwala.

Kheer Bhawani Temple

- Dedicated to the worship of Goddess Kheer Bhawani, situated near the village of Tula Mula, 14 miles east of Srinagar.
- Worship is universal among Hindus of Kashmir.
- Term "kheer" refers to the rice and milk pudding offered to the goddess.
- Goddess has many names: Maharagya Devi, Ragnya Devi, Rajni, Ragnya Bhagwati, etc.
- Built over a sacred spring with a marvelous marble temple and splendid architecture.
- Annual festival on the eighth day of the full moon in May or June.
- Belief that the color of the water in the lake changes according to the avatars of Goddess Kheer Bhawani.

Maa Sharda Devi Temple

- Location and Accessibility: Sharda Devi Temple is situated along the Line of Control (LoC) in the Teetwal area of north Kashmir's frontier Kupwara district. This newly constructed temple offers stunning views of the surrounding landscape and provides a serene atmosphere for visitors.
- **Historical Significance**: Sharda Devi Temple is dedicated to Goddess Sharda, also known as Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and learning. Historically, this site was a significant center of learning and pilgrimage, attracting scholars and devotees from all over the region.
- **Architectural Marvel**: The architecture and construction of this temple have been meticulously done according to mythological scriptures under the aegis of Sharda Peeth. The temple's design reflects ancient architectural styles, providing visitors with a glimpse into the rich cultural heritage of the region.

- The Idol of Sharda Maa: On the auspicious occasion of the first day of the Chaitra Navratri festival, the idol of Goddess Sharda was placed in the sanctum sanctorum of the newly constructed temple. The idol, donated by the Sringeri Math, adds to the spiritual ambiance of the temple.
- **Sharda Peeth Association**: The temple is associated with Sharda Peeth, one of the foremost ancient universities in the Indian subcontinent, akin to Nalanda and Taxila. This connection enhances the temple's importance as a center of knowledge and spirituality.
- Main Sharda Peeth Temple: The ancient temple of Sharda, one of the 18 Maha Shakti Peethas, lies in ruins in the Neelam Valley of Pak-occupied Kashmir. Believed to have been constructed during ancient times, this temple was a significant site for devotees and scholars.
- **Scenic Beauty**: Nestled amidst picturesque surroundings on the banks of the Kishanganga River, the temple offers breathtaking views and a tranquil environment. The serene location is perfect for meditation and reflection.
- **Spiritual Journey**: The journey to Sharda Devi Temple involves a challenging trek, making it a spiritually enriching experience for pilgrims. The trek through the lush green landscapes of north Kashmir adds to the adventure and allure of the visit.
- **Festivals and Rituals**: The temple hosts various festivals and rituals dedicated to Goddess Sharda. One of the most significant events is the annual Chaitra Navratri festival, attracting numerous devotees seeking blessings for knowledge and wisdom.
- Cultural Heritage: The temple holds a special place in the hearts of Kashmiri Pandits, many of whom have ancestral connections to the area. Visiting Sharda Devi Temple offers a unique opportunity to connect with the cultural and spiritual heritage of Kashmir.
- **Tourist Attraction**: Sharda Devi Temple is not only a place of worship but also a tourist attraction due to its historical significance, architectural beauty, and natural surroundings. Visitors can explore the ancient ruins, enjoy the scenic beauty, and experience the spiritual vibe of the temple.

Sightseeing Places Basepoint Pahalgam

Pahalgam

- **Location**: Pahalgam, known as "The Valley of Shepherds", is a town and a notified area committee in Anantnag district of Jammu & Kashmir.
- **Altitude**: Situated at an altitude of 7,200 feet (2,200 m) on the banks of the Lidder River.
- **Distance**: Located 45 kilometers (28 miles) from Anantnag.
- Tourist Destination: Popular for its scenic beauty and status as a hill station.
- Amarnath Yatra: Headquarters of one of the five tehsils of Anantnag district, Pahalgam is associated with the annual Amarnath Yatra. Chandanwari, 16 kilometers (9.9 miles) from Pahalgam, is the starting point of the yatra held every year in July-August.

Fruits Garden / Zawoora Village

- Location: On the way to Pahalgam, you'll find numerous apple orchards.
- **Spring Blossom Festival**: Held annually during the last week of March to the second week of April in Zawoora Village.
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- **Highlights**: Features a spring blossom of various fruits like cherry, almond, apricot, and peach. Includes exhibitions of local and exotic fruit varieties, high-density plantation technology, latest horticultural machinery, post-harvest products, and new varieties of fruit plants.
- **Apple Harvesting**: August is the harvesting season for apples, showcasing the region's rich fruit production.

Saffron Garden / Ladhoo Village / Pampore

- Location: Pampore, a major stopover for tourists, is about 13 kilometers from Srinagar.
- Saffron Fields: Known for its saffron fields, Pampore is one of the few places in the world where saffron is grown.
- **Saffron Facts**: One of the world's most costly spices by weight, with around 75,000 saffron blossoms needed to produce a single pound of saffron spice.
- **Visiting Time**: Best visited during autumn months when the flowers bloom, showcasing rows of purple flowers. A full moon night visit in autumn offers a breathtaking sight with the moonlight shining upon the purple blooms.

Bat Factory / Sethar Sangam

- Location: South Kashmir villages including Bijbehara, Charsoo, Hallamullaha, Sangam, Pujteng, Mirzapor, and Sethar.
- Cricket Bat Manufacturing: Known for cricket bat manufacturing, providing livelihood to hundreds of villagers.
- **Industrial Cluster**: Sethar Sangam in Anantnag is a notified industrial cluster for cricket bat manufacturing, with over 100 factories producing bats sold across the country and abroad.

Avantipora Temple

- **History**: Founded by Avantivarman, the first king of the Utpala dynasty, who ruled Kashmir from 855 to 883 AD.
- **Temples**: Avantivarman built two Hindu temples in Awantipora "Avantisvamin" dedicated to Vishnu and "Avantisvara" dedicated to Shiva.
- **Architecture**: Both temples were built in spacious rectangular paved courtyards and were later destroyed in the middle ages.
- Excavation: Excavated by archaeologist Daya Ram Sahni in the early 20th century.
- **Location**: Awantipora is opposite Pulwama city, on the banks of the river Jhelum, on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway (NH 44).

Martand Sun Temple

- **Dedication**: A Hindu temple dedicated to Surya, the chief solar deity in Hinduism, built during the 8th century CE.
- **Historical Importance**: Built by Lalitaditya Muktapida, the third ruler of the Karkota Dynasty.
- **Ruins**: Now in ruins, the temple is located five miles from Anantnag.
- **Architecture**: Features a colonnaded courtyard with the primary shrine in the center, surrounded by 84 smaller shrines. The temple complex stretches 220 feet long and 142 feet broad.

Aru Valley

- Location: Aru Valley is located about 12 km from Pahalgam, upstream from the Lidder River.
- Access: Can be reached by walking or taxis along a mountain path.
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- **Scenic Beauty**: Noted for its meadows, lakes, and mountains. It is a picturesque village on the left bank of the Aru river, a tributary of the Lidder river.

Betaab Valley

- Cinematic Fame: Named after the Bollywood film "Betaab" starring Sunny Deol and Amrita Singh.
- Location: Northeast of Pahalgam, between Pahalgam and Chandanwari, en route to the Amarnath Yatra.
- Scenic Landscape: Surrounded by lush green meadows, snow-clad mountains, and dense vegetation.
- Nearby Attractions: Baisaran and Tulian Lake.

Baisaran

- **Gardens**: The gardens designed by Jehangir enhance the natural beauty of the spring, making it a must-visit for travelers.

River Rafting in Lidder River

- **Ideal Locale**: The Lidder River in Pahalgam flows through rocky gorges, forests, flower-filled meadows, and high mountain villages, making it perfect for water adventures.
- White Water Rafting: Offers the thrill of conquering swift, swirling rapids as the river gushes past spectacular mountain scenery.

- Upper Portion: Known as 'Bag-e-Begum Abad', developed by Malika Noor Jehan Begum in 1620 A.D.

Kokernag

- **Famous Spring**: Kokernag is renowned for its spring, which gushes out from the foot of a hill covered with evergreen pine trees.
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- **Terraced and Botanical Garden**: Features delicately maintained flower beds, pruned evergreen shrubs, and majestic Chinar trees.

Gulmarg

Gondola Ride

- **Primary Attraction**: The Gulmarg Gondola is the second-largest and tallest cable car installation in the world.

St. Mary's Church

- **Airport Arrival**: Guests need to reach the airport 3 to 4 hours prior to departure due to security checks, long queues, and multiple checkpoints at Srinagar airport.

- Saffron Fields: Visible from October 15 to November 15. Dates may vary by 1-2 weeks.

- **Pahalgam Local Transport**: Guests need to hire local taxis for Chandanwari, Baisaran, Aru Valley, and Betaab Valley, costing ₹2,000 to ₹2,500 per vehicle (6-7 pax capacity).
- AC in Hill Areas: AC will not work in hill areas even if included in the tour. AC will also not work from September 15 to March 15 due to the winter season.
- Heater- Room Heater charges are additional during winter season and can be paid directly to the hotel
